Notes on Degree Requirements for Majors

1. For purposes of meeting program requirements, all Foundations courses will count as 6 credits towards the major. The remaining 3 credits will count towards the total number of credits for the degree.
2. Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies students may complete a maximum of three 9-credit Foundations courses for degree credit. Students who need to complete more than three Foundations courses in order to fulfill program (major or minor) course requirements may do so with permission of the Coordinator of the Program in Classical Studies. This policy is effective starting with the Fall/Winter 2004-05 academic session for all students regardless of the year in which they were admitted to the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies. That is, the policy will not apply to any student who successfully completed more than three Foundations courses prior to FW 2004-05. However, it will apply to all students who complete an additional (i.e. bringing their total to more than three) Foundations course in FW 2004-05 or beyond.
3. General Education courses are to be completed within the first 48 credits taken.
4. No more than 9 credits in each area may count towards the General Education requirement.
5. In a major/minor program, a course may count only once toward major credit or minor credit.
6. General Education courses may be used to satisfy more than one requirement, but are counted only once toward the total number of credits required for the degree.
7. General Education courses used to fulfill the General Education requirement, or major program requirements, may not be used to fulfill required credits outside the major.
8. Additional General Education courses not used to fulfill the General Education requirement or major program requirements, may be used to fulfill required credits outside the major.
9. A maximum of 36 General Education credits will count towards the degree.
10. York residence requirement: a minimum of 30 credits including at least 50% of the major must be completed at York.
11. Cumulative GPA: to proceed in good standing, a minimum Cumulative GPA of 4.0 is needed.
12. Credits for graduation: at least 90 successfully completed.
13. To graduate: a minimum Cumulative GPA of 4.0 is needed.
14. "Every effort is made to ensure that students in the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies have access to sound information and individual advice and guidance. Within this context, and within the framework of Faculty and Program regulations, students are responsible for making their own choices regarding courses and programs."
